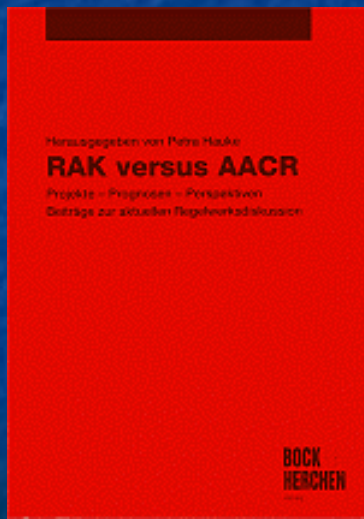

## Voluntary Work in Public Libraries Positions – Models – Basics

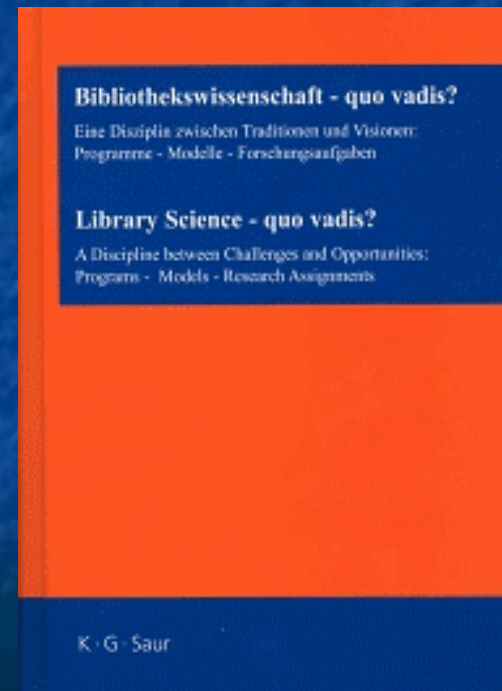
- Voluntary work: A controversial discussion
